The Land of Fire and Ice

2025-2026 Year 4

TERM: Autumn 2

RATIONALE: Southampton Airport are thinking of adding flights travelling to Iceland and they need our help promoting this beautiful country to inspire more people to visit. They need us to create a tourist information centre for potential customers to encourage them to book their dream holiday.

Lead subject: Geography

We will study the physical geography of Iceland looking closely at volcanoes and glaciers. Using atlases, globes and digital maps we will locate Iceland. We will describe Iceland using knowledge of the 5 key lines of latitude and positional language in relation to other countries.

We will also look carefully about what life is like and how people live in Iceland as a result of its unique geography and culture. We will be making geographical comparisons between the capital city of Reykjavik and London.

Lead subject: English

In writing, we will be exploring persuasive language and rich vocabulary to create persuasive travel leaflets which will showcase our geographical knowledge of Iceland.

As well as this, we will be creating detailed setting descriptions of the landmarks and magnificent sights of this wonderful country to further inspire individuals to book their trip of a lifetime.

Lead subject: Art

In art, we will be looking in detail at the natural phenomenon of the Aurora Borealis and the landscape of the land of fire and ice. Alongside this, we will explore different techniques using chalk and oil pastels to create a final pastel piece depicting the Aurora Borealis over the Icelandic skyline.



Applied subject: Computing

We will be using online mapping to explore the location of Iceland. We will use word processing skills to create leaflets. We will also look at copyright and ownership and how these affect us online.
