Rationale:

At Park Gate Primary we have always been a school passionate about books and stories. It's an important part of our identity and as such, it is crucial that we promote that aspect of our school. Can the children in Year 5 help with this promotion by setting up, writing material for and presenting all the content for 'StoryFest'; a mini fringe festival that shows children in other year groups and parents that reading is a central part of who we are? The characters, settings and plots they create will cross genre from narrative fiction to narrative poetry. Using the skill of oral and written storytelling, the children will put on a literary festival with complimentary artwork to enhance the experience. We cannot wait to put on 'StoryFest' for you!



Lead Subject: English

Our storyteller project will take the children on a journey towards creating their own spooky story! Firstly, we shall explore the class poem 'The Highway Man' and delve into the vocabulary. We will then use our understanding of the poem to turn the narrative into prose. To help us on our way to creating our own stories, we will explore the animation 'Francis' to develop our inference skills and retell the story using figurative language. Finally, we shall use the short spooky story of 'Eyes Closed' to inspire us to create our own spooky stories, filled with suspense.

Lead Subject: Art

Charles Keeping is an amazing artist and illustrator. He uses lots of techniques to draw and sketch pictures that perfectly compliment Noyes' emotional 'Highwayman' poem. We will study how he draws and see if we can use his style to encapsulate the settings, characters and plots within our spooky, atmospheric stories.

Applied Subject: Computing

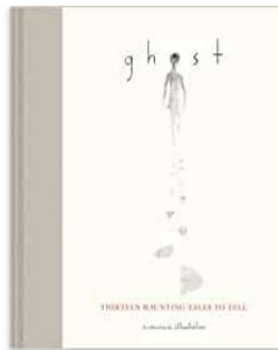
We will be exploring **Scratch**, where they learn to design, create, and debug simple animations, games, and interactive stories.
